

Onassis Nottage serves as the 2018-2019 President of the University of The Bahamas Student Government Association and Chairman of the 2018 Conference of Youth Leaders for National Youth Month. He manages all committees under the Student Government Association and is a conference planner who works with student leaders at the University of The Bahamas to enhance the campus experience for his fellow students.

Onassis was born July 27th 1996 in New Providence, The Bahamas. He graduated from C.R. Walker Senior High School in June 2014, and is currently pursuing a dual degree; a BSc. Mathematics and an ASc. Engineering Physics at the University of The Bahamas.

At his alma mater, he has been a member of the Governor General's Youth Award, Gentleman's Club, Information Technology Cadets, the PROS Bahamian American Football team, and chartered the C.R. Walker Brotherhood Association, and the Robotics Club. He graduated the Academic Science program as the Class of 2014 Deputy Head Boy, Student Council President, Salutatorian, and Information Technology Cadet of the Year.

He was also given the opportunity to chair the Appointments, Great Debate and Policy Drafting Committees, and most notably, the 2017 Conference of Youth Leaders.

As the President of the Student Government Association, he's established policymaking templates, the Conscious Kids Program for mentoring family island students in The Bahamas, a sexual harassment policy for students and faculty, received a \$300,000 donation to renovate the Student Union Building, received a \$50,000 donation to renovate the Grosvenor Close Center lounge area for nursing students, a \$20,000 donation towards getting university students to travel and so much more.

Onassis' goal before he leaves office is to establish a Bahamas Student Government Association that focuses on advocating for and promoting the welfare and interest of high school, home school, technical and vocational, college and university students.
